Kentucky Partners with Hamilton-Ryker to Create New Apprenticeship Programs in Lexington

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Feb. 20, 2019) – Kentucky Education and Workforce Development Cabinet (<u>EWDC</u>) Deputy Secretary Mike Nemes joined officials from <u>Hamilton-Ryker</u> in Lexington today to announce the creation of new manufacturing and IT apprenticeship programs.

As a program sponsor and intermediary, Hamilton-Ryker's "TalentGro" offers Registered Apprenticeships that will serve as a pipeline in both manufacturing and IT. With over 20 different paid apprenticeship roles, apprentices will work alongside experienced professionals in manufacturing and IT to develop skills and advance in their careers.

Hamilton-Ryker is one of the largest employee-owned staffing organizations in the country, providing workforce solutions for industrial, administrative and information technology staffing and recruitment. Through "TalentGro," the agency will address the skills gap in today's workforce by using a mix of education and training, real-world application and on-the-job training.
