The scholarships are intended to provide career pathways for high school students who are 18 or older or who have recently graduated from high school; and an opportunity for others who are changing their careers and are eager to get into the Manufacturing industry.

We are currently looking for employer partners that are willing to bring on temp-to-hire or long-term workers with little to no experience, but who demonstrate the potential to learn quickly and become a valuable asset.

Scholarship recipients learn while they earn

The recipients of the scholarships will complete on-line courses while they are working for you. There are two options for obtaining either a Certificate of Completion or a Certification. Option 1 will provide 12 courses from ToolingU-SME that will introduce participants to the manufacturing industry. These courses include:
